

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Weep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Xeep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- » Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Weep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

PROPANE Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

FACTS

- July is the peak month for grill fires.
- Provided in the second of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.



A Note from the Cumberland County Mosquito Control Program:

Mosquito diseases have been in the news a lot this year, but it's always best to be educated and prepared.

Adult mosquitoes often stay in the surrounding areas near where they hatch. Gutters, birdbaths, and buckets are often prime mosquito rearing habitat, so remember to check around your house weekly and dump containers holding water every few days to ensure a bite-free summer.

PLANNING COMMISSION

The Planning Commission has been working hard over the last months on a proposed warehouse project on the Ickes property along Rt. 233. Our big concern is the plan to use injection wells (now being referred to as "gravity wells" by the developer) for storm water dispersal. The property, as is much of Penn Township, is over a large aquifer. We are concerned that putting storm water into these wells could have an adverse effect on many nearby private wells and streams, even Newville's municipal water supply. The Township has hired a hydrogeologist to assist us in sorting through this matter and we will keep you up to date in future newsletters. The Planning Commission meets the third Monday of each month. The public is always welcomed at our Planning Commission meetings and we appreciate all input.
